Our Subject Learning This Week

Reception	In Geography, we have identified the Polar Regions (the North and South Poles) on a world map.
Year 1	In PE this week, we have been practising different gymnastic shapes and creating a sequence of movements.
Year 2	In Music, we have enjoying singing our song 'I wanna be in a band'.
Year 3	In Italian, we have been looking at how Italy celebrates Lent.
Year 4	In Literacy, we have been practising using direct speech in our writing. We have learned about inverted commas and how to punctuate dialogue.
Year 5	In Maths, we have been working on finding the missing number in multiplication sums using our multiplication knowledge.
Year 6	In Science, we have had an amazing time learning all about the heart. We dissected hearts, role played how the heart pumped blood around the body and created our own blood to learn about its properties.

Solidarity and Peace

This half term our Catholic Social Teaching focus was 'Solidarity and Peace'. Solidarity is a word which can be overused and little understood. 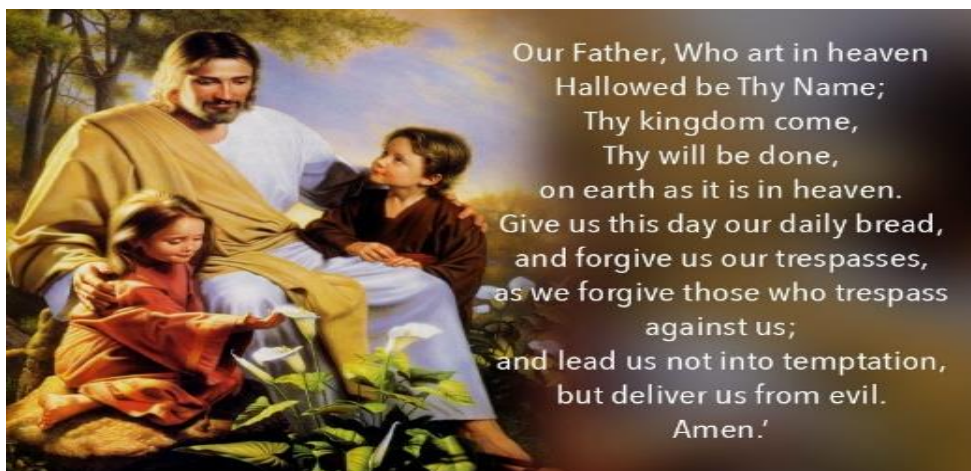
The Year of Prayer

World Book Day

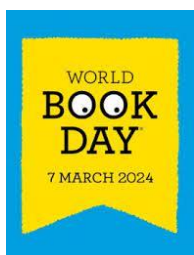

Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday

To celebrate Shrove Tuesday a number of exciting things happened within the Early Years and Key Stage 1 classes. Reception class did not let the weather spoil the celebration and children took part in a pancake flipping contest! Key Stage 1 got to sample pancakes with a selection of toppings at lunchtime. Fun was had by all children.



Key Stage 2 had a pancake race and ate pancakes to mark Shrove Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday is the last day before Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Lent is the Christian period leading up to Easter, a time when many people fast or give up something they love. This time is a reminder for Christians of **Jesus Christ's sacrifice and his withdrawal into the desert for 40 days**. In preparing to give up richer foods as part of Lent, pancakes began to be eaten on Shrove Tuesday. This was because people would use up richer foods such as eggs, sugar and milk before Lent began, which when combined, can make pancakes.



Year 3 to Year 6 went to Mass at 2pm on Wednesday to be blessed with ashes, Father Julian and the congregation praised the prayerful atmosphere and beautiful singing of the hymns, including a Taize during the Blessing of the Ashes. Thank you to the many families and friends who joined us to celebrate Ash Wednesday.
