Curriculum



- Children will be undertaking Maths, Writing and Reading lessons in the morning.
- In the afternoon children will carry out RE and foundation subjects such as Science, History and Computing.
- RE takes place for 2 and a half hours each week.
- PSHE or RSE takes place weekly.
- Art or D&T will be taught weekly. If you could please provide the children with an old men's shirt which will remain at school. This will be worn during any practical lessons.
- The School Mile will is available for the children to use daily.



Expectations

- All children have a responsibility to live out our Mission Statement:

- Children are expected to follow our school rules as well as class rules. Class rules have been created with the help of the children.
- Children are also expected to follow the school's Golden Rule:

Homework



- Homework is set on a Friday via Atom and should be completed by the following Friday. Each week there will be an English and Maths activity set. In addition, there will be weekly spellings which are to be tested on a Friday.
- Times Table Rock Stars should be practised daily, even if it is just for 5 minutes. Mrs Baldwin will be running regular competitions. Winners will receive a certificate which will be presented in Celebration Assembly.
- The children should read at home daily and the home-school book should be signed.



PE



 P.E. takes place twice a week on a Tuesday and Friday. On Tuesday, the PE session will be led by a Sports Coach. On Friday, the PE session will be led by Mrs Baldwin.
