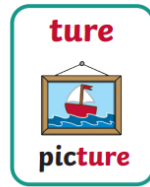
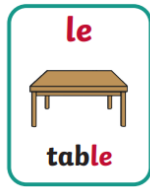
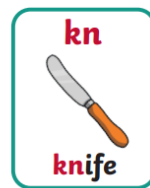
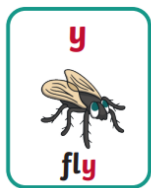
We learnt about what was eaten at a medieval banquet and we created our own menus.

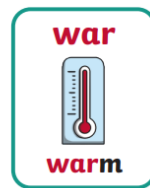
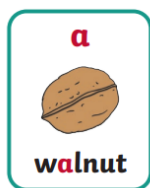

Sabrina Cohen-Hatton was born in South Wales in 1983. Her life was hard when she was a teenager. She became homeless when she was 15 years old. She did not have any family to help her.



Job

Sabrina Cohen-Hatton joined the fire service when she was 18 years old. She was the first female firefighter to work at her station.

Sabrina Cohen-Hatton now works as a Chief Fire Officer. This means that she has to make sure that all of the firefighters who work with her stay safe as they help people. She has written a book all about her job.
