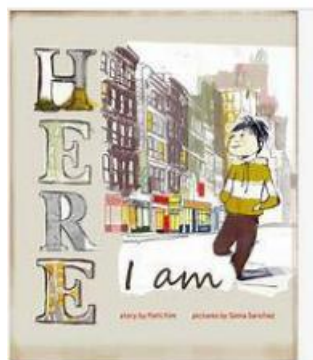
PE

How Can Someone Be a Good Friend?
