We looked at photos of the seaside in the past and present and compared them. We thought about what has changed over time.

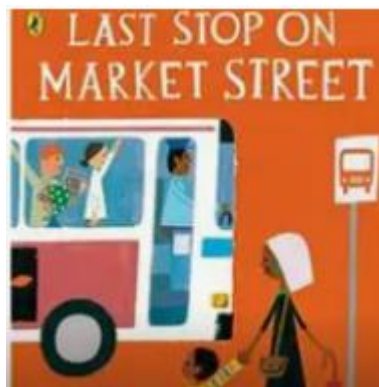
PSHE

Planting Trees

All trees start life as a seed. Trees are important for wildlife, such as insects and birds. They would find it hard to live without the food and shelter that trees give to them.

Growing Your Seed

You will need:

- a tree seed, such as an acorn
- a plant pot with holes in the base
- some small stones
- compost
- wire mesh
- spade



How to Grow Your Seed

1. Put some stones in the bottom of the pot.
2. Fill it with compost.
3. Plant the seeds 2cm deep.
4. Put the pot outside in a shady corner.
5. Cover the pot with wire mesh to stop birds from eating it.
6. Check it every week.



Where to Plant Your Tree

You should look for somewhere where your tree will have plenty of space. If you have more than one, plant them about 2 metres apart.

It is important to think about where you want to plant your tree and the size that the tree will grow to. A tree may be small when you plant it but think about how big it will grow over the years.

How to Plant Your Tree

- Press your spade all the way into the ground and push it forward to make a slit deep enough for the tree roots.
- Keep the slit open using the spade and place your tree inside with the roots first.
- Remove the spade and push the soil back around the tree.
