Geography

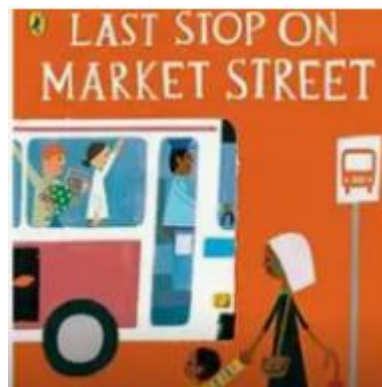
This week, we researched seaside resorts on the laptops and wrote down key facts.

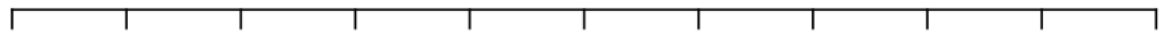

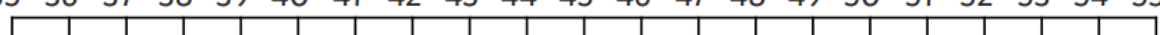

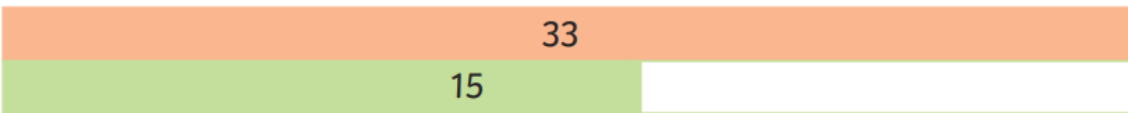
